- Drop in – social support

Post Diagnostic support

What have we learned?

- Diagnosis is just the beginning ... support as a continuum
- Whilst specialist interventions are important, the majority of autistic adults need to have access to a range of “low level” support that is easy to access and where their needs are understood.
- Autistic adults often fall through the gap between services
- People need support to access services – Care act assessment, mental health support , housing queries, PIP assessment, employment, mental health/physical health , education
- Access to the autism community is important – peer support
- Making Trafford “*Autism Friendly*” is everyone’s responsibility the importance of working together

Post Diagnosis group

The Challenge!

- A group for people who don't do groups
- An opportunity to meet other people
- To “normalise” experiences
- To challenge and offer understanding of some of the negative experiences
- It wasn't my fault – I'm not stupid, difficult, weird
- To support each other
- To feel more accepting of myself



- Are keen to help us to develop post diagnosis support in Trafford





Post Diagnostic Group

An 8 week structured group – topics include

- The diagnostic process
- Feelings about the diagnosis
- Disclosure
- Services and support
- Living with Autism – includes relationships, anxiety, masking, building resilience
- Sensory differences

“ It was also educational, and at times humbling, to listen to others’ experiences and seeing where there was and wasn’t overlap with my own. They taught me, ultimately, that having an ASC, thanks to those bad memories, is not something you come to terms with immediately. - 
- ▶ This is a service for adults over 18 , without a learning disability, living in and registered with a GP surgery in Bolton.
 - ▶ It is aimed at those people who are seeking a diagnostic assessment for a suspected Autism Spectrum Condition (ASC).
 - ▶ Following diagnosis via the Trafford service, users are eligible for post-diagnostic support from the Bolton Team.
 - ▶ New service for people with existing diagnosis – “Living with Autism”

I want

- ▶ A timely and thorough assessment
- ▶ My diagnosis explained to me and a written report to refer back to
- ▶ Recommendations and advice on where to get support when I need it
- ▶ Opportunities to meet other people with autism
- ▶ To understand and learn ways of coping with my condition
- ▶ Autism awareness training programmes
- ▶ To access support when I need it on a regular basis
- ▶ My family to have support
- ▶ To not be treated like a patient – I am not unwell
- ▶ People to communicate with me in ways I can understand and be on time to appointments and do the things they promise to do
- ▶ To be comfortable in being myself and be in safe places to do this

The Team

- ▶ The team comprises of professionals who work together to provide diagnostic services for adults who have an ASC.
- ▶ Multidisciplinary team of Clinical Psychology, Occupational Therapy, Speech and Language Therapy, Social Work, Community Nursing and Support Staff

How we work

- ▶ Staff work flexibly with individuals, families, carers and other professionals in their everyday surroundings - including people's own homes, primary health care centres, colleges, places of work and in-patient services
- ▶ The service's office base also provides clinic space and other facilities.
- ▶ A multi-disciplinary approach is taken and the process of work is a team process
- ▶ Work closely with other professionals involved – GP/CMHT/EIT – and other agencies such as Bolton University, employers, Job Centre etc.

The Numbers

Year 1 : 15 people

Year 2 : 41 people

Year 3 : 84 people

Year 4 : 120 people

Why the demand ?

What We can offer

- ▶ Short term post-diagnostic intervention – this includes an individual, person-centred multi-disciplinary assessment – the Autism Star, which indicates individual areas of strength and difficulty. Personalised Action Plan identified and agreed
- ▶ Working alongside the person, carers and family, partner agencies (probation/police/education) and employers, as well as other professionals involved
- ▶ Signposting for a Community Care assessment if required.
- ▶ Carer and Family support
- ▶ Consultation with and referral to other services – recommendations on treatment and consideration of medication
- ▶ Group/autism expert course
- ▶ Peer mentors

Living with Autism

- ▶ STAR assessment
- ▶ 5 sessions
- ▶ Invite to attend the group/course
- ▶ Consultation
- ▶ Carers support/Community Care assessment

Autism Awareness training

- ▶ E-learning for staff developed by Anna
 - ▶ One off training
 - ▶ Recovery Academy
- ▶ Peer mentors/United Response
